# Warren County Highway Honors Former NC Congresswoman

A section of Interstate 85 in Warren County has been joyfully dedicated to honor former Congresswoman Eva Clayton!

In mid-September friends, family, and officials from the N.C. Department of Transportation gathered to celebrate both her birthday and the highway dedication. The signs along I-85 stretching from Ridgeway Drewry Road (Exit 226) to the Warren-Vance County line proudly commemorate her inspiring legacy in North Carolina.



Clayton earned her bachelor's degree in biology from Johnson C. Smith University and a master's in biology and general science from North Carolina Central University. She made history as the first Black woman to represent North Carolina in Congress, passionately advocating for the First Congressional District in the northeast. Her journey into civic and political life was ignited by the civil rights movement. In 2022, Gov. Roy Cooper presented her with the North Carolina Award, the state's highest civilian honor. Clayton still resides in Warren County, where she remains an active and beloved member of the community!

# Jeremy T. Jones Appointed Assistant County Manager





Vance County Manager C. Renee Perry has appointed Jeremy T. Jones as the new Assistant County Manager effective October 1, 2024. With over 10 years in law enforcement, including roles from Patrol Deputy to Administrative Sergeant, Jones brings expertise in public safety, strategic planning, and community outreach. Perry expressed enthusiasm for Jones's leadership, noting his commitment to enhancing county services and community well-being. Jones holds degrees in Criminal Justice and Administration and has been with the Edgecombe County Sheriff's Office since 2017.

Participants are encouraged to ask questions or discuss specific incidents they were involved in. Each presentation will last approximately one hour, depending on the participation level from the attendees. More participation equals a longer discussion, and is strongly encouraged!



# Kerr-Tar Projects Selected for Funding in the Regional Impact Category

NCDOT has released the regional scores, as well as informed Kerr-Tar RPO that 6 projects have been selected for funding in the Regional Impact Category for the draft 2026-2035 STIP.

**Franklin County** 

 Widen to multi-lanes - NC 56, NC 581 (Nash Street) in Louisburg to SR 1229 (Main Street) \$46,000,000

 Widen roadway. The project is a modification of H090813 (NC56 from Franklinton Bypass to US 401/NC 56 in Louisburg NC where the proposal is to widen to 4 lanes. This abbreviated project shortens the length of the project and widens to 4-lanes and is located entirely in KTRPO. \$58,000,000

**Vance County** 

- Construct the Alexander Avenue extension to SR 1267 (Dabney Dr) and grade separation with road OVER rail. Project also includes: (1) closure of SR 1228 (Chavasse Avenue) existing at-grade Crossing # 630 489N, (2) closure of Spring St at-grade Crossing # 630 488G, and (3) construction of Peachtree St pedestrian access tunnel/bridge in Henderson, NC. Project includes minor track realignment as needed. \$28,450,000
- Improve intersection where Belmont Drive and Welcome Avenue meet \$2,800,000
- Install Citywide Signal System \$5,036,000

Person County

 Replace 5 Lane Facility with 4 Lane Facility with Planted Median. Reduce Number intersections; Add Sidewalks to Both Sides of the Road Where they are missing. Includes intersection improvements at NC 157 / Johnson Street / Hurdle Mills Road / South Main Street AND NC 49 (Leasburg Road/Chub Lake Street). \$26,700,000
