Town of Butner Announces New Town Manager: Jordan McMillen

After completing a nationwide search that yielded 30 qualified applicants, the Town of Butner is pleased to announce that Jordan McMillen will serve as Butner's next Town Manager. The Town Manager search involved an extensive interview process with the assistance of Developmental Associates, a North Carolina-based firm. Final candidates were interviewed in early April, and a contract with candidate McMillen was approved on April 17th, 2023. McMillen is scheduled to begin his new role on **June 12th, 2023**.

Kerr-Tar COG Awarded 2023 Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Grant

On Wednesday, April 12th, the Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments (COG) was informed by the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) that the organizations recent application for the 2023 Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Non-Infrastructure Grant Reimbursement grant had been selected for award for this year's grant cycle. The Kerr-Tar COG's project was **one of 12** selected for



this grant type from across the state. Our SRTS program began in 2019, when our organization was first awarded funds for this project. We will use funds from the new 2023 SRTS grant cycle to continue our programs bike and pedestrian safety endeavors within the region for K-12 students. The Kerr Tar Workforce Development Board Reentry Roundtable, in collaboration with NCWorks and Granville County Economic Development, presented a Reentry Simulation at the Granville County Expo Center on Tuesday, April 18th, 2023. This was another successful simulation with key regional and community leaders in attendance including: Congressman Don Davis' office, Vance and Granville County Schools, Granville County Chamber, Granville County Sherriff's Office, local businesses, Durham County Manager's office and many more vital community leaders attended. This simulation offered valuable insight and resources that were useful for participants to gain a better understanding of the significant barriers faced by individuals after their release from incarceration. Community involvement and support is always critical to help these justice-involved individuals avoid recidivism and that is why it is vitally important as community leaders to be involved in these simulations!

The request are pouring in to have more of these simulations throughout the region, so if you missed the latest one, there will be more opportunities for you to be involved!


