About 1 in 8 women born today in the United States will get breast cancer. Breast cancer is the second most common cancer among women in the United States, next to skin cancer.

Some women are at higher risk for breast cancer than others because of their personal or family medical history or because of certain changes in their genes. Getting regular mammograms may lower the risk of dying from breast cancer.


# A MATTER OF BALANCE TRAINING

# REGIONAL HOUSING SUMMIT

On September 11<sup>th,</sup> Kerr-Tar COG held its Regional Housing Summit at Vance Granville Community College, where approximately 100 attendees gathered for a dynamic and engaging event focused on housing challenges and strategies for local governments. The day began with opening remarks from Diane Cox, Executive Director of the Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments.

The morning featured two insightful keynote presentations:

- "Escaping the Housing Trap" by Chris Allen, Director of Events and Partnerships at Strong Towns, who explores the systemic issues behind housing affordability and community development.
- "Affordable Housing Strategies & Tools for Local Governments" by C. Tyler Mulligan, Distinguished Professor at the UNC-Chapel Hill School of Government, offers practical tools and policy insights for local decision-makers.

After a short break, the program continued with a panel discussion, featuring diverse perspectives on housing solutions. Panelists included Dennis Tharrington, President of Innovative Green Builders, John Morck, Wilson County Planning Manager and Heather Joi Kenney, CEO of Gateway CDC, and Lindsey Rosenfeld, Lead Policy & Research Analyst with NC Housing Finance Agency serving as moderator.

The event concluded with an interactive working session where participants collaborated on actionable strategies to address local housing issues.

The Kerr-Tar Workforce Development Board/NCWorks along with Person County EDC hosted a highly successful Person County Job & Resource Expo Sept 10, 2025 at Piedmont Community College South Campus drawing strong participation from both employers and job seekers across the region.

The event welcomed 55 employers and community resources, representing industries such as manufacturing, healthcare, education, transportation, and public service. Employers were eager to meet potential candidates and share information about career opportunities, while resource providers offered valuable support services to help individuals prepare for success in the workforce.

More than 100 participants attended from all five counties in the Kerr-Tar region—Franklin, Granville, Person, Vance, and Warren—demonstrating the wide-reaching impact of the event.
