Affordable Connectivity Program Wind Down

The \$14.2 billion Congress initially made available for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is running out. Due to the lack of additional funding for the ACP, the Commission has announced that April 2024 will be the last month ACP households will receive the full ACP discount, as they have received in prior months. ACP households may receive a partial discount in May 2024. After May 2024, unless Congress provides additional funding, ACP households will no longer receive the ACP benefit and the ACP will end.

Call your Internet Service Provider and ask them about free and low cost internet plans that may help you and your household.

Many Internet Service providers offered "Free and Low Cost Internet Plans" before the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). It is expected that many will offer these Plans again when ACP benefits end. By doing so, Internet Service Providers will prevent having ACP households cancel their services.





Requirements for Federal Funding for EV Charging Infrastructure

When applying to different sources of federal funding, the maze of requirements from various agencies can be confusing. What is required for Build America, Buy America? Do chargers need to be publicly accessible? What qualifications are required for electricians installing the chargers? This webinar will cover these questions and more.



Brownfields Job Training Grant

Training programs funded by the Brownfields Job Training Grant provide program graduates with the opportunity to seek and obtain environmental jobs that contractors may otherwise fill from outside the affected community. EPA intends to use this grant opportunity to support the creation of good-paying jobs with the free and fair choice to join a union and the incorporation of strong labor standards and workforce programs. Brownfields Job Training Grants help residents take advantage of jobs across a spectrum of brownfield related activities, including the assessment, cleanup, remediation, and planning/site preparation for the revitalization of brownfields. This can involve the assessment and cleanup of solid and hazardous waste; chemical risk management; stormwater management relating to site cleanup; planning and site preparation for low impact development activities; planning and site preparation for green infrastructure installation and maintenance; and vulnerability assessment and contamination mitigation planning. Applicants will be evaluated on the extent to which they partner with and secure hiring commitments from local contractors and other stakeholders in communities where EPA-funded projects are located.

Tri COG FEEDS

On May 14, the 2+ year Tri-COG FEEDS (Food Ecosystem Economic Development Study) project culminated with a regional convening hosted by Kerr-Tar, Upper Coastal Plain, and Central Pines Regional Councils of Government at the NC Rural Center in Raleigh. Attendance totaled almost 100 participants, representing a wide variety of backgrounds, including municipal planners, economic development, farmers, nonprofits, business owners, funders, and practitioners from across the food system. The day's events included a panel discussion on the role of local government in improving food system resilience, breakout activities reflecting on and discussing the Tri-COG FEEDS findings, office hours with funders, and vision casting for the future of the three regions represented.
