

Celebrate with America 250 NC!



We are excited to share that the NC Department of Natural and Cultural Resources (DNCR) is leading the America 250 NC initiative to commemorate the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution.

Starting <u>April 12, 2024</u>, and continuing through <u>December 2026</u> (with additional events through 2033), North Carolina will host a wide range of activities to honor this historic milestone. DNCR is planning extensive statewide activities and supporting local commemoration efforts. They are holding virtual statewide stakeholder meetings to discuss and encourage local planning. Resources like a planning guide are being developed to assist local institutions.

The NC General Assembly has also created the **America 250 NC Local Grant** Program to support local commemoration efforts. Our goal with encouraging official county committees is to provide a mechanism for oversight on the local level for coordination of commemoration events. Although the initial grant cycle is closed, applications will reopen in August 2024. For more information and resources click *here*.

KT AAA Elder Abuse Event

Kerr-Tar AAA held their 10th Annual Elder Abuse Awareness and Prevention Conference and Walk on June, 14th 2024 at the Masonic Home for Children in Oxford, NC. The event was well attended with representation from all five counties along with surrounding counties in NC (Wake, Durham, Orange and Halifax counties). A new record was set in Granville County this year with 30 different vendors from our region and across the state, and approximately 246 participants.









Special thanks to Granville County DSS for their partnership in organizing the event, all the vendors, staff, volunteers, & guest speakers!

Highlights:

- World Elder Abuse Awareness Day Proclamations were read from the Governor and City of Oxford Mayor.
- All participants took a commemorative Walk in support of **Elder Abuse Awareness and Prevention** even in the heat!
- Over 20 residents attended from Granville House ASL and Angelica House FCH.
- 30 different vendors participated.

SRTS Partners with GVPH to Give Helmets to Mi Centro Program

The **SRTS** (Safe Routes To School) Program teamed up with **GVPH** (Granville Vance Public Health) to provide 30 kids in the **Mi Centro Program** a bag full of goodies regarding biking safety. Our previous Regional Program Coordinator, Kenia Gomez, packed all their goodies and ensured they received reflective wristbands, bike reflectors, and lights to encourage safe biking. Most importantly, they were gifted **30 bike helmets** provided by the NCDOT Grant in collaboration with GVPH. The Mi Centro is a program for students who will be entering Pre-K in August of 2024. When Hurricanes Are Most Common

June 1st to November 30th

Warning Signs

- Tropical storm or hurricane watches and warnings issued by meteorological agencies
- Increasing wind speeds and heavy rainfall
- Rising sea levels and storm surges

Preparing Your Home

- Install storm shutters or board up windows with plywood
- Reinforce garage doors
- Secure outdoor furniture and objects

Keeping Your Pets Safe

- Plan evacuation routes that include pet-friendly shelters
- Microchip pets to find them if lost
- Have a pet emergency kit

Keeping Livestock and Farmland Safe

- Move livestock to safe, elevated areas
- Secure equipment, feed, and chemicals
- Have a plan for relocating animals if needed

What To Do In Case Of Emergency

- Follow evacuation orders issued by local authorities
- Stay informed through weather updates and emergency alerts
- Seek shelter in a sturdy building away from flood-prone areas
- Watch out for downed power lines that may still be live
- Do not travel unless necessary

+ Building An Emergency Kit









- Non-perishable food and water for several days (aim for at least 1 gallon of water per person per day)
- First aid kit and necessary medications
- Important documents in a waterproof container
- Flashlights, batteries, and a weather radio
- Extra clothing, blankets, and personal hygiene items

Have Your Say: Join the STIP Feedback Sessions!

Exciting news! The **N.C. Department of Transportation (NCDOT)** is inviting everyone to provide feedback on transportation projects for the 2026–2035 STIP. The STIP is developed under the Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) law, which established the Strategic Mobility Formula. These sessions will help shape the Draft STIP due next year. You can find a short video about this outreach effort *here*.

NCDOT is hosting 14 regional outreach sessions from **June 18 to July 10** to gather input on local priorities. Your feedback is essential in shaping the Draft STIP, due next year. The public comment period runs from **June 17 to July 17, 2024.** Please share this opportunity with your friends, family, and colleagues. Let's make our voices heard and shape the future of our transportation network together! Later this summer, NCDOT will release project scores, and the highest-scoring projects will be prioritized based on funding and other factors. Uniting Forces: Request for PRICE Main Funding for Housing



Central Pines Regional Council (CPRC), in partnership with Rebuilding Together of the Triangle (RTT), Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments, the North Carolina Justice Center, Community Home Trust, and the UNC School of Medicine Community Practice Lab, is requesting PRICE Main funding to expand upon current partnerships to comprehensively advance support and drive long-term solutions for the preservation and development of manufactured housing in central North Carolina.

Such efforts will improve opportunity, accessibility, and financing for affordable housing, with a focus on manufactured housing in 11 counties throughout the CPRC and Kerr-Tar regions – particularly for the region's most underserved populations. Titled the Regional Affordable Housing Partnership (RAHP) in Central North Carolina, this collaborative partnership will serve Chatham, Durham, Johnston, Lee, Moore, and Orange counties in CPRC's region, and Franklin, Granville, Person, Vance, and Warren in Kerr-Tar's



According to BAND-NC, **more than 130 people from 40 different North Carolina counties joined**. BAND-NC looks forward to hosting more digital inclusion events in the future.

The upcoming federal grant, **Digital Equity Capacity Grant**, was applied for by North Carolina and will have <u>three rounds</u> of funding available.

Learn More Here:

- Local communities would apply at the state level—if North Carolina is awarded.
- The application window for local governments to apply would open late summer or early August.
- NTIA Competitive Grant will have three tranches and will be available for everyone *but states* and will require collaboration for a competitive application.
- The North Carolina state grant, Digital Equity funding will support large-scale digital equity programming. <u>The application window opens in late summer or early fall.</u>




Dunnaven Francis
